







Budget and Treasury Portals

- Progress. Strong achievement of overall use of portals in majority of countries.
- **Focus on:** Accessibility, accuracy, timeliness, use, citizens engagement, positive impact on accountability, presentations and understandability, and media access to information.
- Simplicity. Translate government complex information to meaningful and relevant information for general public.
- Legal framework good but not enough. Legal framework is good which needs to be enforced.
- Voice and impact. How to make the voice and participation effective and impact budget allocation and ultimately service delivery.
- **Performance monitoring and accountability.** The oversight organizations receiving feedback and response from citizens and not only reports from subordinated organizations. Obligation to timely respond to queries received.

Fiscal transparency assessments and impact

- Identify gaps from different perspectives: IMF Frosc-Macro Fiscal Position, PEFA and OECD survey MOF, and OBI citizens helps to identify gaps and concentrate on their improvement.
- Reform priorities and strategy: They contribute to shape reform priorities and strategy development (e.g. TSA, Accrual accounting, cash management, arrears prevention, citizens budget, etc.).
- From diagnostic to action. This is sometimes a challenge!
- **Reconfirm understanding.** Increased confidence on the relevance of the reform actions already taken.
- Overlap. Duplications and some overlaps if possible to avoided.
- **Self assessment.** Once when done it could be repeated by countries themselves to check the progress.
- **Competition**. The ranking (e,g OBI) is important for many counties which is a strong incentive for change.
- **Impact**. The change on the ground in addressing the gaps is more important then rating.
- **Timing**. Linked and more relevant to the political change in the country.
